Dear Friends

Since our November Newsletter we have had our AGM via Zoom. This was not ideal but at the time with the uncertainty of the Covid situation it was considered a safer option. As we have seen the Omicron variant has reeked much havoc in our communities. We cannot afford to be complacent.

The Australian Mothers Union Council meeting which was to have been held in Melbourne in November was also held via Zoom. Normally a three day 'live-in' meeting, it was condensed to a three hour Zoom session. I missed the opportunity to share with other Australian Diocesan presidents that we have when meeting as a community. The main topic of discussion was a renewed focus on gender violence. 'No more 1 in 3' was the call. It is an alarming statistic – throughout the world 1 in every 3 women are subjected to domestic abuse.

Resources for '16 Days of Activism against Domestic Violence' which had been put together by some of the members of the Australian Mothers Union Executive were given to each of us and we were encouraged to make use of them in our dioceses. These resources were distributed to Branch Contacts but by the time we had received them most branches had already finished meeting for the year.

I am getting in early for 2022 and encourage you to consider including a discussion about this in your planning for later in the year. We were also advised that the 2022 Prayer Diary would not be available in printed form until March. It is available on the Newcastle Mothers Union website.

Hopefully by the time you are reading this Newsletter you will have received your copy of the Prayer Diary together with the latest edition of Mia Mia. If not please know it will soon be available. Using the Prayer Diary in your daily prayers is an important aspect of being a Mothers Union member. As well as the cycle of prayer it also contains a wealth of information about what Mothers Union is doing throughout the world.

This year we have adopted the theme of Mothers Union Worldwide:

'The Time for Transformation is Now' and have chosen the Scripture:

"For nothing will be impossible with God" Luke 1.37

as a reminder that we are not alone. As we focus on the theme of transformation we are encouraged to look at how and what we used to do in our branches, how and what we do now and how and what we can do in the future. The principals of MULOA – Listening, Observing and Acting are as relevant now as they were when we first started talking about them.

We welcome Barb Warland as a vice President on our Diocesan Executive and also welcome Lynn Mulley who has agreed to edit future editions of the Newsletter. Transformation and Kindness

Dear friends.

As I reflected on our theme for this year, "The Time for Transformation is Now" and the many changes in our lives, I found myself wondering at the process. All of us are changing, all the time, whether we realise it or not, and so is our world. I believe our theme calls us to be active participants in transformation rather than passive recipients and to place our hope and trust in God for transformation "for nothing will be impossible with God." Often when we think about transformation, we think of the big picture things, an end to family and domestic violence, universal peace, wars being a part of history rather than a part of our lives, oppression being a memory, hunger, and homelessness no longer existing in society and we can feel overwhelmed by the pure magnitude of the changes that need to occur for these systemic changes to be realised. All these changes are transformational. Every individual voice that speaks for one of these transformations of our world is an added voice to the call for transformation. Our voices and our choice to speak up or to remain silent have an impact on others and they impact our own lives.

As the world fights to figure everything out, I'll be holding doors for strangers, letting people cut in front of me in traffic, saying good morning, keeping babies entertained in grocery lines, stopping to talk to someone who is lonely, being patient with sales clerks, smiling at a passersby. WHY? Because I will not stand idly by and live in a world where love is invisible. Join me in showing kindness, understanding, and judging less. Be kind to a stranger, give grace to friends who are having a bad day, be forgiving of yourself - today and every day BE the change, BE the light, start today and never stop.

Several times over the past weeks I have seen this post on my Facebook feed and every time I see it, it speaks a little more deeply to me. Because transformation is all the big picture things, but it is also all the small acts of kindness and love that we show to those around us. For we never know how our generosity, patience, love, faith and kindness will impact another person. Perhaps our kindness will encourage them in some way and perhaps it may transform their day.

I am sure we have all thought about times when someone else has shown this sort of kindness to us. I know I have often said that these moments have "made my day!"

Perhaps transformation is practiced in the little things so that we know that whatever we do has an impact on others. Perhaps this is God's way of showing us that when we trust him and our actions are done on the foundation of faith that "nothing will be impossible for God." I pray that this will give us confidence that as we add our voices to the things that need to be transformed. As Christians, we trust that God calls, knows, and loves all people. So, when God places a cause on our hearts, we can be assured that our voice will make a difference in the lives of others and in our own lives. We may not witness this, but we can be assured that it happens. Just as our smile for a stranger may brighten that person's day, so our voice added to any call for transformation will be heard.

Transformation is a beautiful thing, but it requires of us to be active participants. If we only think about transformation, then nothing much will change, but if we actively seek out and follow the call God places on our hearts, if we add our voices to a call for change, if we stop to chat to someone who is lonely, or help another in any way, then we can and do change lives. As we respond to God to reach out to, to stand up for, to call for change ... God works through us to bring lasting change and in doing so transforms the world.

I invite you to ponder where God may be calling you to be part of transformation and I pray that God will bless you in all that he calls you to. May we shine God's transformative light and love in all the places that we are present as we seek to serve God and people of God.

May the blessings of God rest gently upon us all.


Please bring your own mug and snack.

COVID SAFE INFORMATION for LADY DAY MASKS ARE MANDATORY

Service commences at 10.30am. Registration available from 9.45am If possible use the main entrance into the Cathedral.

If you need to use the disabled access please let me know in advance (0437 266 506) and someone will be at this entrance to greet you.

On arrival please register with the QR method of registering using your mobile phone. If you do not have this facility your name and phone number will be recorded manually.

Registration is mandatory Hand sanitiser is provided. Please use this on arrival.

MORNING TEA: Please bring your own mug and snack for morning tea. Hot water, tea, coffee, milk and sugar will be provided. Once you have registered and have your morning tea please find a seat observing_social distancing requirements.


